5. Guest Presentation (15 min)

5.1 Stephanie Godrich, summary below:

Stephanie examined whether food security (FS) determinants (things like food availability, household finances, nutrition knowledge etc.) significantly predicted adequate vegetable consumption among regional and remote WA children.

After testing individual associations between each FS determinant, the factors that met inclusion criteria were entered into full multivariable logistic regression analyses. After accounting for socio-demographic factors that are known to influence vegetable consumption among children (such as child age, socio-economic status etc.), the FS determinants that significantly predicted adequate vegetable consumption were: variety of vegetable types consumed (I.e. Fresh, frozen, tinned, dried, juice); caregiver recall of a health message relating to vegetables (I.e. Go for 2&5); location of outlets (belief that there were enough food outlets in their community); and price (belief that healthy food did not cost more in their community compared to other communities).

Recommendations include advocating to food outlet managers to stock and promote a range of vegetable types through point-of-purchase and interactive methods and health practitioners promoting consumption of a range of vegetable types (such as fresh, frozen and reduced salt tinned options); reinstatement of a specific action-based vegetable message campaign (such as Go for 2&5); Local Government Authorities ensuring a number of opportunities exist in towns for families to source vegetables (i.e. healthy food outlets, community gardens etc.); and increasing reliance on a local food supply/shorter food chains to reduce cost.
